SPECIALIZED CARE

In times of crisis, parents want to know that their child is receiving the very best care from professionals at the top of their field. The emergency room and trauma center at Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children in Orlando gives them that peace of mind.

It is the only Level I Pediatric Trauma Center in Central Florida. Children have 24/7 access to pediatric emergency physicians, and to almost two-dozen pediatric specialists in



surgery, critical care, neurosurgery, orthopedics, cardiology, neurology, gastroenterology, and anesthesiology, among others.

"We have thirty-three beds, including four resuscitation and trauma rooms," says Dr. Mark Clark, who is board certified in pediatric emergency medicine. "This is an awesome resource. There's probably nothing comparable in terms of bedside treatment elsewhere in the community."

And Central Florida's only stand-alone pediatric emergency room was designed not only to

attend to a child's critical care, but also to comfort and even distract them from the moment. Each private room is decorated in soothing tones and playful touches right down to the purple, teal, and blue-striped privacy curtains decorated with dogs, flowers, and fish. Each has a television and a phone, and the waiting area has a playroom to keep active siblings occupied.

HANDLE WITH CARE

The neonatal intensive care unit at Winnie Palmer Hospital for Women & Babies is the most comprehensive resource for newborns in Central Florida, says Dr. David Auerbach, who is board certified in neonatology and is medical director at the hospital.

"The NICU is there for even the sickest babies," says Dr. Auerbach. "But we're able to do just about anything medically possible."

Winnie Palmer Hospital is a state-of-the-art, family-centered hospital focusing on continuity of care that strives for optimal outcomes. From the first trimester through birth, a team of physicians specializing in each stage of pregnancy sees women and their babies.

Women also have access to lactation specialists, social workers, and developmental specialists who can address special needs before and after moms and babies go home.

Even seemingly normal pregnancies and labors can produce the unexpected. "If there is going to be a surprise, this is certainly where you want to be," says Dr. Auerbach. "Our ability to quickly address any condition is unparalleled in Orlando."

Three years ago, Kairn Dodge was standing on the brink of a health disaster. She was morbidly obese, and the complications that come with it were quickly piling up. But with the help of the caring and committed team at Puget Sound Surgical Center, Kairn walked away from that abyss and into a new life.

"The people at Puget Sound Surgical Center are amazing," says Kairn, who has lost half of her former body weight. "They offer such a comprehensive program. Once you walk through that door, you're part of that family, and they really take care of you."

Doctors and staff at Puget Sound Surgical Center are dedicated to the unique care each patient needs, and they realize that weight loss surgery can be the first step in a lifetime commitment to change.

"We specialize in laparoscopic and minimally invasive techniques," explains Dr. Peter Billing, who is a Mayo Clinic trained, board certified general surgeon and an American Society for Bariatric Surgery member. "The traditional weight loss method of diet and exercise has a success rate of only five percent after five years, whereas bariatric surgery has a long term success rate of ninety percent."

Puget Sound Surgical Center offers both Gastric Bypass Roux-en-Y (laparoscopic roux-en-y gastric bypass) and the LAP-BAND®. The center's medical and professional staff helps patients decide which procedure is right for them. They've performed thousands of these laparoscopic procedures with great success.

But that's just the beginning of a nurturing relationship.

Tools for Change

"One of the most important things for our patients is the relationship we establish with

them," says Dr. Robert Landerholm, who is a board certified general surgeon and a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons. "They're in a safe, comfortable environment where they can get all of their questions answered, and we're always available to them. Weight loss is a long term endeavor, and we want them to know that they'll never have to go it alone."

Patients of Puget Sound Surgical Center work with bariatric nurses, nutritionists, psychologists, and physical therapists in order to meet their goals.

After years of not being able to bend over to tie her shoes, fit comfortably in an airline seat, or even walk around the block, Kairn now runs three days a week, weight trains, and counts parasailing and scuba diving among her many hobbies. The former chef still loves to cook and dotes on her family in the kitchen. The team at Puget Sound Surgical Center helped Kairn learn how to deal with food in a positive way.

"Weight loss surgery is a tool that helps you rework your relationship with food," says Kairn, who lost 150 pounds. "I eat like a skinny person now. It's so liberating, and it just feels so good. My only regret is that I didn't do it twenty years ago."


